The industry is very varied and offers excellent opportunities for installation, project and design engineers, as well as for technical sales personnel.

On the manufacturing side there are opportunities for design, production and sales engineers.

There are also opportunities with specialist consultancy practices. These might require degree level qualifications in acoustics or electronics.

If you don't have a degree in a relevant field of study, and don't yet have a background in audio or AV, ISCVE can help guide you on your pathway to a career in the industry.



Qualifications

- Recommended subjects to study at A level are maths, physics and computer sciences.
- Many companies will be pleased to help fund part-time study, BTECS, apprenticeships and more vocational subjects.
- While having a relevant degree is, without doubt, beneficial – a passion for music, electronics, audio or video equipment, will go a long way with a potential employer.
- Course searches for acoustics, audio engineering, broadcast engineering, live event technology on the UCAS website www.ucas.ac.uk should bring up some useful programmes.
